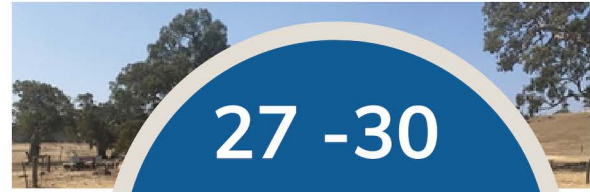


Uncertain Times - Strategies to prepare for Spring
